The K&P is responsible for all trail activities for the remaining clubs as well as for those areas once covered by the dissolved clubs "Ompah, Robertson Lake, & Silver Lake"

Once again this year, we were fortunate to receive some grant money to assist us in doing considerable upgrade to the 104A trail from Lanark to Snow Road Clubhouse. New bridges were installed on trails near Plevna and Perth. Other upgrades have been completed in various other locations.

Theft of signs and vandalism continues to be a serious threat to the safety of all trail users.

Missing signs are not only an inconvenience to local and visiting snowmobilers but could result in a serious injury. Removal or defacing of these regulatory signs is a criminal offence. Please, report missing signs to club contacts.

Remember we cannot open our trails until the landowner gives us permission. Often these private lands are in use for the various hunting seasons. Also, sufficient snow has to accumulate to allow trails to be groomed at least once and gates or bars are opened. Water crossings will not be opened until conditions permit. Lake crossings are not opened until staked. We are continually striving to improve our trail system and to eliminate as many ice crossings as possible. Please check trail conditions and observe the signage.
