If you would like to get involved, come out to our meetings held on the 4th Wednesday of each month at the Snow Road Snowmobile Clubhouse or talk to any of the executive for more information about the many areas we could use some help. We are all volunteers and even a few hours can make a difference.

Thanks to the National Trails Coalition grants last year we were able to make significant trail improvements in some key areas (i.e. the 104A trail from Lanark to Snow Road Clubhouse). We hope you got a chance to check them out. This year, Ontario Tourism has given \$3M in funding to the OFSC and the K&P has received some of this funding (which is matched with our own funds) to reroute part of "E" Trail between Perth and Carleton Place to avoid the swamp area where K&P connects to BEAST trails. Through co-operation with BEAST and Rideau Ridge Runners and several landowners, this section of trail should be open throughout the season. Efforts continue to develop trails which avoid swamp and water crossings to ensure early opening and good connections with neighbouring club/association trails.

Several new volunteers have stepped up and are making great progress working with landowners to open trails in the Plevna area we expect to have the trail open from Malcolm Lake to Plevna this season. A warm welcome is extended to to Larry Trenwith, new member on the executive along with Roger Free who has come forward to work on this project.

Without the generosity and support of our many, many landowners our trail system would be unable to function. All snowmobilers are asked to respect private property and stay on the groomed and marked trails to avoid damaging these lands. Landowners grant permission to snowmobilers for the use of these trails during the winter season. They are not public trails for access by other users in the off-season. Inconsiderate access by some ATV and off-road vehicle operators creates problems resulting in closure of trails.

Again, we remind you that some landowners do not allow access for trail maintenance or preparation until the various hunting seasons are over – and not just the traditional rifle season but the black power and bow seasons as well. In many instances, farm animals are still occupying the grazing land and gates cannot be opened until the landowner agrees.

Even after that great first snowfall, there is a lot of work to open the trails. Not all snow makes a good base for the season and many of our trails are over rough terrain which requires significant snowfall to create a groomed trail. Then there are the many gates or bars to be opened and ensuring signs are still in place or installed for the new season.

All swamp or water crossings require freeze-up to ensure safe crossings. Stakes are not put up until there is sufficient ice depth.

Missing signs are not only an inconvenience to local and visiting snowmobilers but could result in serious injury. Removal or defacing of these regulatory signs is a criminal offence. Please report missing signs to club contacts. Signage is a key part of the OFSC risk management program and many of the legal claims against the OFSC indicate missing or inappropriate signage on the trails.

Training sessions on signage, trail grooming, chain saw operation and other safety practices will be held Nov. 21st.
